

The Building Limes Forum is holding its annual Conference & Gathering at The Liverpool Medical Institution, Liverpool. The conference theme is Lime and Aggregates, and is open to members and non-members alike. Would you like to join us?

On Friday there will be lectures and visits to some of the major historical buildings in Liverpool to view conservation projects. Saturday will include practical demonstrations, further lectures with a practical bias and the option of further visits. Sunday morning will be devoted to members' and delegates' short presentations with further visits in the afternoon.

Speakers will include building practitioners and professionals, who are at the forefront of current developments in the use of lime. It is hoped that at the end of the Conference delegates will have a better appreciation of the suitability of the wide range of available

lime mixes for specific types of work and the way regional climatic conditions affect the selection.
